## Aims of Learning a foreign language in Primary School

- Foster an interest in learning another language
- Introduce young learners to a different rich language environment in a way that is enjoyable and fun
- Stimulate and encourage learner's curiosity about language
- Encourage learners to be aware that language has structure and that structures differ from one language to another
- Help learners to understand cultural differences in other countries - Intercultural Understanding
- Develop their speaking and listening skills


## Early Years and KS1 Objectives

## Reception objectives

Informal introduction to French and recall of new vocabulary through group activities and actions in songs, stories and games Children can join in with structured activities, mainly focussing on speaking and listening

## Year 1 Objectives - end of year

Can respond to simple, known songs with gestures eg head, shoulders, knees and toes
Can follow and repeat sounds for vowels (a, e, i, o, u)
Can respond with actions to stories read aloud
Can identify 4 colours: red, blue, yellow, green - some will know/recall more
Can exchange simple greetings
Can understand simple praise words - très bien, bravo, fantastique!
Can sing the Happy Birthday ong in time with the rest of the class
Can understand numbers $1-10$ (some will know more)

## Year 2 Objectives - end of year

2.1 Can respond to a variety of known and new songs with gestures to show understanding
2.2 Can sing along recalling new vocabulary
2.3 Can pick out key words from familiar stories and rhymes read aloud
2.4 Can "play" with French sounds through songs and games, including 'tricky' phonemes such as $u$, ou, an, un
2.5 Can correctly say the 4 colours from Year 1 plus 6 more colours: white, orange, brown, pink, grey, black
2.6 Can ask and respond to the question: Comment ça va? Comment t'appelles-tu?
2.7 Can understand simple classroom commands, such as silence, asseyez-vous, levez-vous, fermez les yeux, levez la main 2.8 Can say the month of their birthday
2.9 Can understand a variety of descriptive adjectives, eg grand.e, petit.e
2.10 Can count from 1 - 10 forwards and backwards (maybe more)
