What will it look like for your children?

Signing Up!

In order for us to ensure we staff the school the best we can, we ask that you must sign up via the school website at the latest by 6pm the evening before your child attends Key Worker School. Completion of this sign up form will confirm your place.

As we are working in phases, learning sessions at Key Worker School will involve completion of the home learning which has already been set by their class teacher. We will support each child with this and have planned other fun activities too! See example timetable below.

Please ensure that all children bring a healthy snack as per usual St. Stephen's guidelines. A hot meal will be provided for lunch. You will be asked to order in advance online (more information on this to follow). Children can also bring packed lunch if they prefer.

Arrival and Dismissal

Q: How will the day start?

A: The school will be open from 8.30am for a soft start in the School Hall where colouring, books, Lego and CBBC will be available. A member of SLT will be present should you have any questions or concerns.

Q: Where shall I collect my child from?

A: At the end of the day, please collect your child from the school playground at 3.30pm. If your child is being collected at a different time, come to the school office. Please let us know if there are any differences in pick-up arrangements from those we already have on record. If your child is in Year 5/6 and we have written permission, they can walk home alone.

Key Worker School: Uniform

We ask children to wear appropriate clothing for art and sport - unbranded where possible. No football shirts please. As we have several fun and creative activities planned, please be warned it's likely that these clothes could come home messy! If your child prefers, of course, they can wear a school uniform or PE kit.

Staffing

At present we have been able to timetable staff to work in three phases.

This would mean that children would be grouped in:

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2

Year 3 and 4

Year 5 and 6

All children will be on break and lunch together

However, as staffing is highly likely to be an ever-changing picture, this may be subject to change, for example we may merge phases. Where possible, we are trying to ensure there are always both teaching staff and support staff in each phase to support the children.

Reminder

Stay at home if you have either:

- A high temperature – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature).
- A new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual).
- If you have symptoms of coronavirus, you'll need to stay at home for 7 days.
- If you live with someone who has symptoms, you'll need to stay at home for 14 days from the day the first person in the home started having symptoms.
- Do not go to a GP surgery, pharmacy or hospital.
- Use the 111 online coronavirus service to find out what to do.
